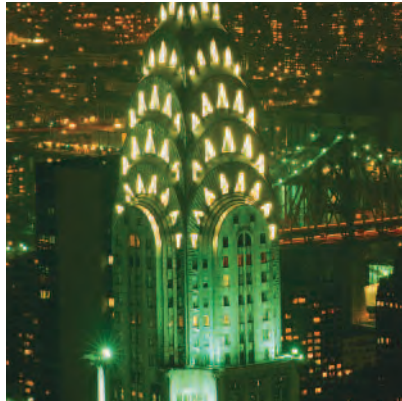

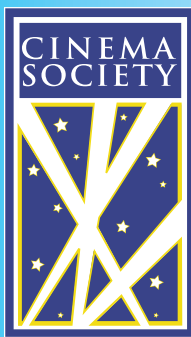

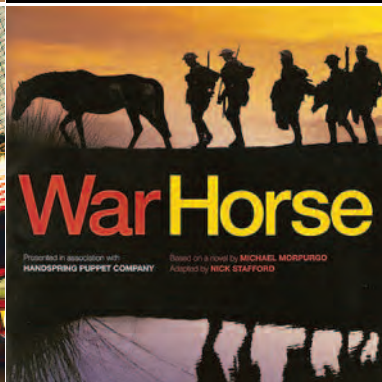
I've got to be a part of it

There's also the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island...the Brooklyn Bridge...strolls down Fifth Avenue...shopping at Macy's and Bloomingdale's...an energized Times Square...dim sum in Chinatown...pizza in Little Italy...and around every corner a world of entertainment and discovery.*

NYC ITINERARY

This is only a SAMPLE itinerary. A final itinerary will be issued approximately 30 days prior to departure.

Monday April 23

We depart in the morning from your choice of San Diego or Phoenix on our non-stop flight to New York, arriving in the late afternoon. We will then transfer via private coach to the first-class Millennium Broadway Hotel, just off Times Square, directly in the heart of Broadway's Theatre District. After check-in, join us for a welcome dinner party at a local restaurant.

Tuesday April 24

Our day will start with a private sightseeing bus tour of the city. We will become acquainted (or re-acquainted) with the marvelous grid of Manhattan from Wall Street at the southern tip, where colonial-era churches and monuments endure in the shadow of the Federal Reserve Bank, the Stock Exchange and towering office buildings, all the way to the serene Cathedral of St. John the Divine on the upper West Side. Our first stop will be the 911 Memorial in Lower Manhattan. Occupying eight of the 16 acres at the World Trade Center, the Memorial is a tribute to the past and a place of hope for the future. Afterwards, it will be Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts for a behind-the-scenes look at this iconic NYC venue. Tonight for our first production, we'll be going back to Lincoln Center to see the masterful Tony Award winner, **WAR HORSE**.

Wednesday April 25

This morning you are invited to a brunch and theatre forum at The Players. This private club, founded in 1888 by the greatest American actor of his time, Edwin Booth, still caters to a membership of people connected to "theatre, music, film, literature and the arts." It houses the Hampden-Booth Theatre Library, considered the finest repository of theatre references, art and memorabilia of its kind. In the afternoon, we will be seeing our first film presentation at the Tribeca Film Festival. Tonight's theatrical production will be... **THE BOOK OF MORMON**.

Thursday April 26

The morning will start with breakfast at New York's most renowned delicatessen, Carnegie Deli. Founded in 1937, the world famous Carnegie Deli is a true New York City landmark, described as a place where your "taste buds have gone to heaven but your waist line has gone to..."

We'll then be going down to South Street Seaport for our cruise around Manhattan. We will pass by many of New York's most legendary landmarks along both the Hudson and East Rivers including the Statue of Liberty, the Empire State Building, the Chrysler Building and the Brooklyn Bridge. In the afternoon, we'll meet with guides who will lead personalized walking tours throughout the city. You might find yourself visiting the Lower East Side Garment District, SoHo's eclectic art galleries and boutiques, colorful Chinatown and Little Italy, or the hustle & bustle of Midtown and the magnificent Grand Central Terminal. Tonight, another Tribeca Film awaits.

Friday April 27

This morning, another walking tour is planned. This time, try a different Manhattan tour or even another borough of New York. There's so much to see in Brooklyn with Brooklyn Heights and the Brooklyn Museum or head north to the Bronx for a visit to the Bronx Zoo and the New York Botanical Gardens. In the afternoon, another Tribeca film is scheduled. Tonight will be our third Broadway production. (TBA)

Saturday April 28

In the morning we will be meeting for breakfast and a talk with a New York theatre or film professional for an inside look at the New York arts scene. Afterwards, we'll be going down to one of the most unique and fascinating areas of New York for a visit to the Lower East Side Tenement Museum. The museum preserves and interprets the history of immigration through the personal experiences of the generations of newcomers who settled in and built lives on Manhattan's Lower East Side, America's iconic immigrant neighborhood. Here we will have the opportunity to see a New York City tenement building first-hand, as it was at the end of the 19th century. The afternoon will be free to wander the city at your leisure visiting some of the world-renowned museums and landmark historic sites. Your evening is free.

Sunday April 29

The morning is free to explore the city on your own or just catch up on some last minute shopping. We will be departing for the airport in the early afternoon. Your flight arrives back in San Diego or Phoenix in the evening.
